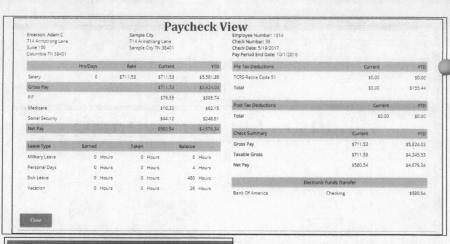

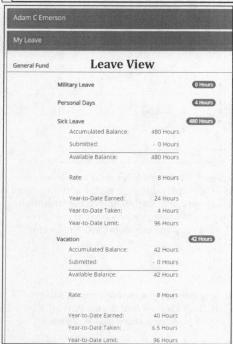

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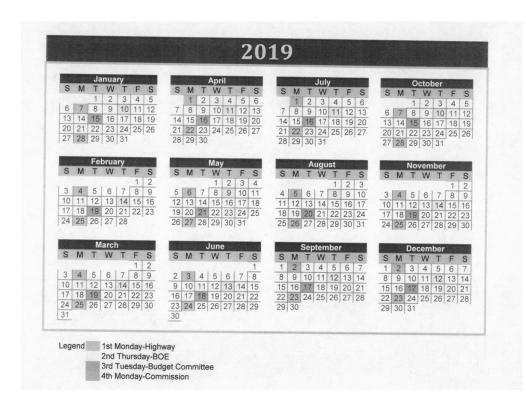

Dear Mayor and Commissioners:

I am writing to thank Union County government for its support of the efforts of our office and law enforcement to combat illegal drugs in our district.

On December 4, 2018, the Union County Financial Management Committee, Mayor Bailey, Director of Finance Ann Dyer, Sheriff Billy Breeding and myself entered into a Memorandum of Understanding whereby any monies awarded to the Eighth Judicial District Drug Task Force through federal forfeiture from cases resulting from activity of the task force shall be paid into the Union County, Tennessee Department of Finance; and that said monies shall be distributed as follows: twenty percent (20%) to the Union County Sheriffs Office to be used solely for the support of said office and eighty percent (80%) to the Eighth Judicial District Drug Task Force to be used solely for the support of the task force. Union County was chosen to accept these funds because it is approved by federal authorities to do so. I believe that this arrangement is a win-win for both the Union County Sheriffs Department and our drug task force in that it allows monies recovered from illegal drug transactions to make their way back into our communities to support local law enforcement efforts. I strongly believe that it is a good outcome any time law enforcement can be funded from those who violated our laws, not law-abiding citizens.

Should there be any questions about Union County serving as a pass through for any federal forfeitures awarded to our drug task force, please do not hesitate to let me know.
